Eyke Parish Council

The Parish Council was pleased to welcome a new councillor, Neil Smith, who has been co-opted to fill the vacancy following the May elections. At the same time, they were sorry to receive the resignation of Jan Stangoe, a councillor for some years, and thanked her for the valued support she had given over that time. The process of filling this vacancy will commence once East Suffolk Council receives notice of the resignation, and the notice of vacancy is posted in the public domain. This will be on the website, and posted locally in the village in the bus shelter. If an election is not requested within the time frame given, the parish council is free to co-opt a volunteer.

The annual inspection of the playground has taken place, and all was generally found to be satisfactory, except for undue wear on the frame of the basket swing, which has possibly been caused through misuse by older children above the recommended age limit. Repair to this is being put in hand immediately. New "No Dogs" signs will be affixed, as the original ones have disappeared, and people taking dogs into the play area continues to be a problem.

Contributions to the fund for benches in memory of Mervyn Whitmore continue to arrive, and it is possible that there will be money left over, which will be donated to the charities he supported.

Once the wording for the inscription is agreed, the benches will be ordered from *Realise Futures* which is a social enterprise supporting disadvantaged people across the community. The benches are eco-friendly, made from recycled plastic, durable and long lasting. The total cost for two, including inscriptions is £1227.18 plus vat.

Work will be carried out to refurbish the bus shelter at the end of July and will take a couple of days. Although we have a parish noticeboard in the churchyard, the space available in the bus shelter for notices is a valuable asset.

There is no news yet on the amended Denbury Homes application: please keep looking at the parish website and the Eyke Facebook page for updates. www.eyke.onesuffolk.net A village meeting will be organised at the earliest opportunity to discuss the amendments.

The clerk announced her intention to retire at the end of September, and hopes that a replacement can be in place by then. Please see the job description below.

Vacancy for Parish Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer

Eyke Parish Council is looking for an enthusiastic person to take on the post of Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer.

The position is part time, 4 hours per week working from home. The hours of work are flexible, except for attendance at meetings, of which there are 6 per annum, on the second Monday of every other month at 7.00pm. There are occasional extra ad hoc meetings, to discuss time-sensitive issues, such as planning applications.

Salary will be based on the National Association of Local Council's pay scale, and is dependent upon qualifications and experience.

Duties include acting as an advisor to the council, agenda preparation, minute taking, dealing with correspondence, liaising with District and County Councils, filing and accounts and administration of the parish council website.

Prior experience is an advantage, but clerk training is available through Suffolk Association of Local Councils.
