Eyke Parish Council

The planning meeting to discuss the Denbury Homes application to build 65 new houses in Eyke was well attended by about 35 people on Monday, 13th February. A wide ranging discussion took place, and finally the following list of representations was agreed on as a response to both the original application, and the duplicate one lodged in January.

- The need for a bigger car park on the site
- The moving of the 30mph limit beyond Graylyns
- A s278 planning agreement to be a planning condition, and a construction development plan.
- The provision of a biodiversity net gain policy and an Environmental Impact Assessment
- A street lighting plan to minimize the lighting impact
- A walkway through from the site to the school
- An undertaking from the District Council that no costs associated with the lighting or the play area would be the responsibility of the parish.
- An undertaking from Anglian Water that the supply, currently with low pressure a problem affecting some residents, would be enhanced to avoid further problems.

The last Parish Council meeting of the current session will be on Monday, 13th March in the hall at 7.00pm. Following that, Councillors will stand down, prior to the election on 4th May. This is a chance for anyone interested in serving the local community to stand for election. Nomination forms are available from the clerk.
