The Vicars Voice – May 2023

According to Christian tradition, the Day of Pentecost commemorates the day when the Holy Spirit was poured out on <u>the disciples</u> in Jerusalem after the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Many Christians mark this date as the beginning of the Christian Church as we know it.

The Day of Pentecost, celebrated on the 28th May this year, is celebrated 50 days after Easter and often churches are adorned in red, with red altar linen, priests robes, flowers, banners and even balloons!! The red signifies the winds of fire representing the Holy Spirit as it descended on the disciples in a locked room, as the breath of God. It is considered to be one of the great festivals to be celebrated after Christmas and Easter.

Pentecost is seen as the coming of the Holy Spirit, descending from heaven, promised by Jesus when he said he would never leave us or abandon us and is also considered to be the birth of the church. The Anglican priest, poet and singer-songwriter Malcom Guite wrote the following about the birth of the church and Pentecost:

Today we feel the wind beneath our wings
Today the hidden fountain flows and plays
Today the church draws breath at last and sings
As every flame becomes a Tongue of praise.
This is the feast of fire, air, and water
Poured out and breathed and kindled into earth.
The earth herself awakens to her maker
And is translated out of death to birth.
The right words come today in their right order
And every word spells freedom and release
Today the gospel crosses every border
All tongues are loosened by the Prince of Peace
Today the lost are found in His translation.
Whose mother tongue is Love in every nation.

The Sunday after Pentecost is when we celebrate Trinity Sunday, and we think of God as the great 3 in 1,God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit.



Christians believe the Trinity is three distinct persons sharing one nature.

Three divine persons in which each persona of God reveals attributes unique to each, so that everything comes from the Father who created us, through the Son who redeems us and the Holy Spirit who upholds and sustains us.

And of course, this year we have the historic occasion at the beginning of the month of the Coronation of a new King, something some of us will possibly only ever experience once in our lifetime. And the Coronation service is grounded in faith, with many symbolic gestures, such as the anointing with Holy Oils of the King and Queen Consort.

May our prayers be with Charles on this historic day. God Save the King!
